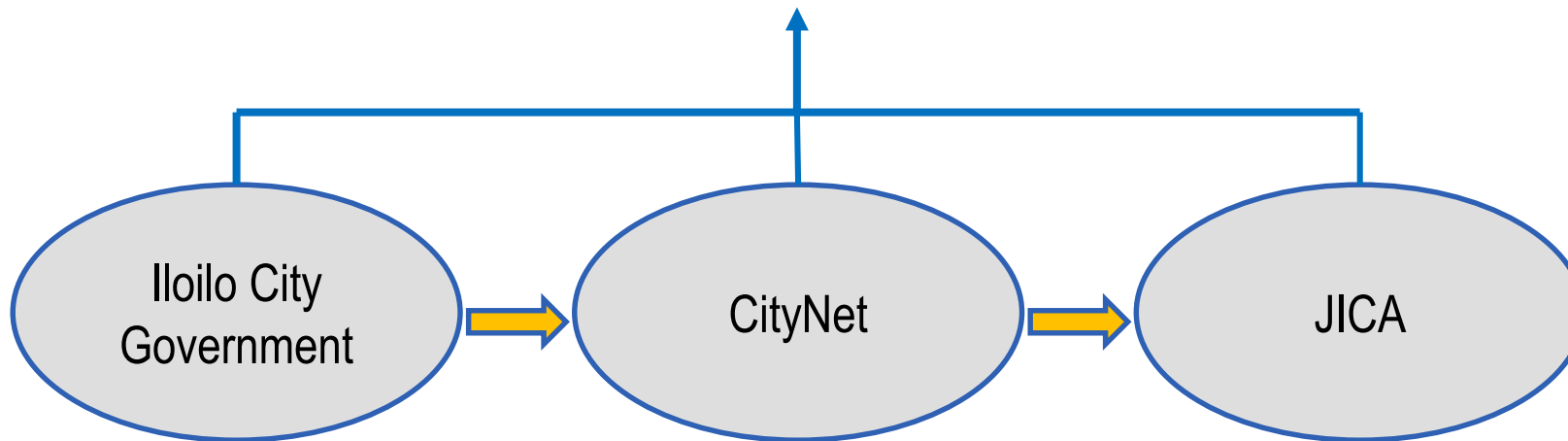

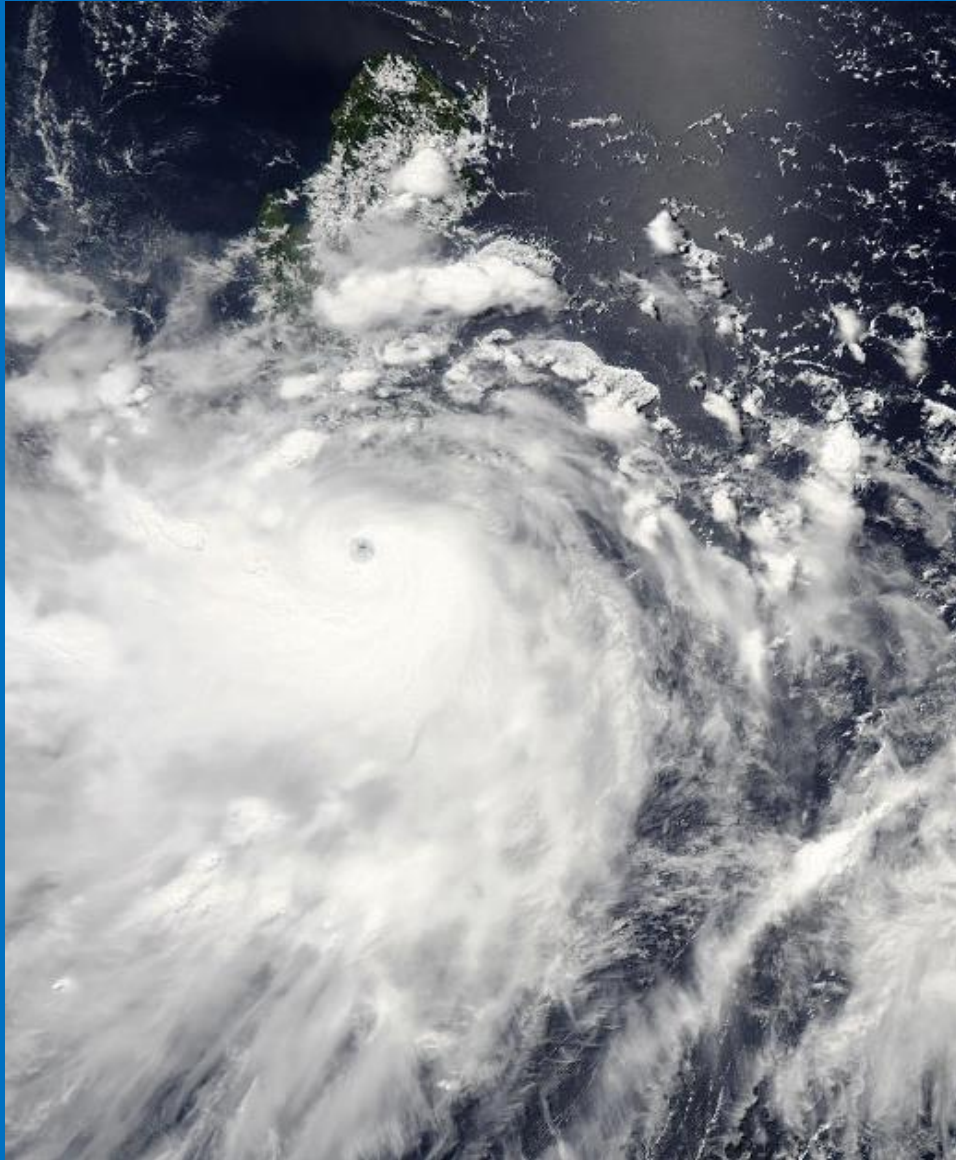

2012 – 2014 CBARAD Project Phase I (3 years)

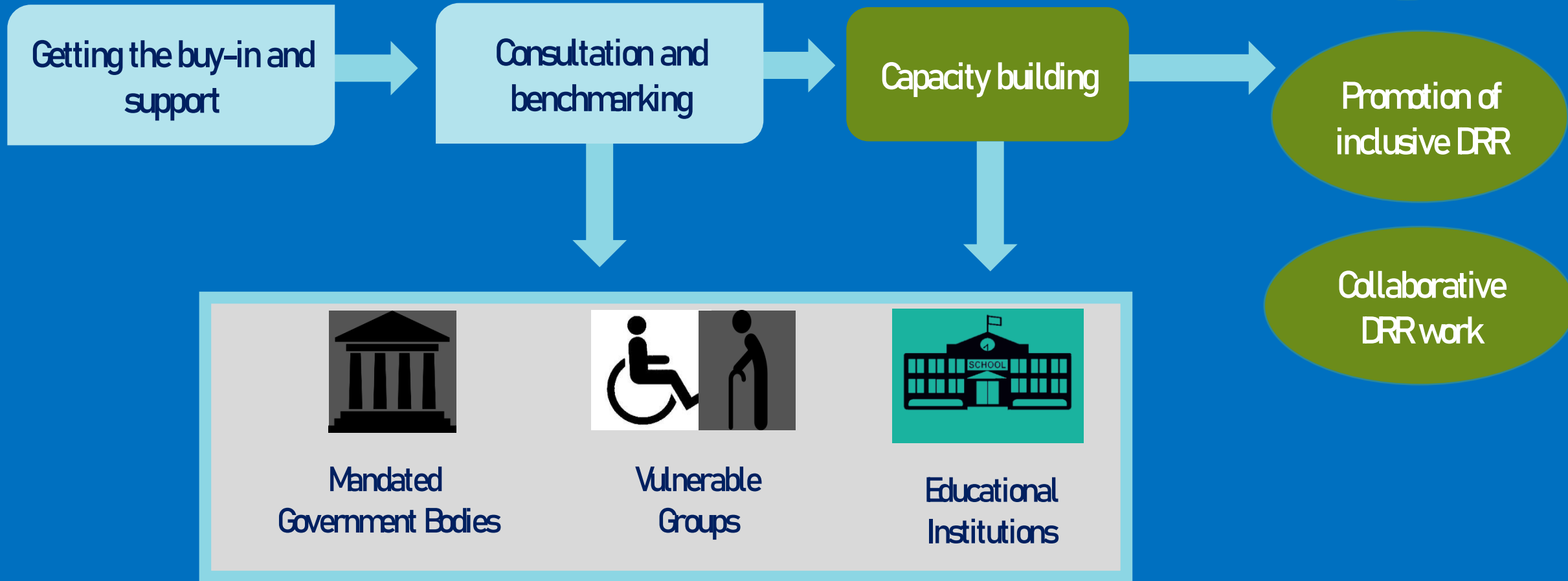

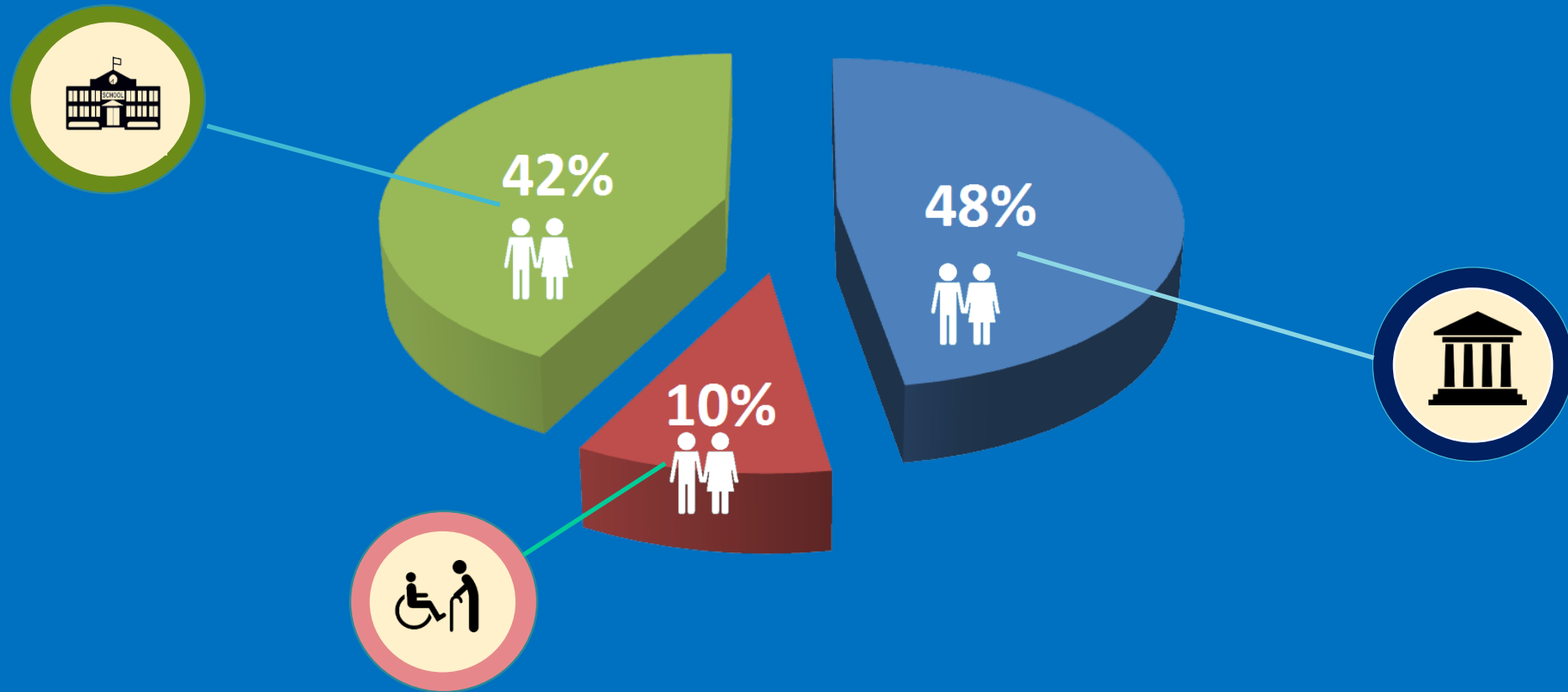

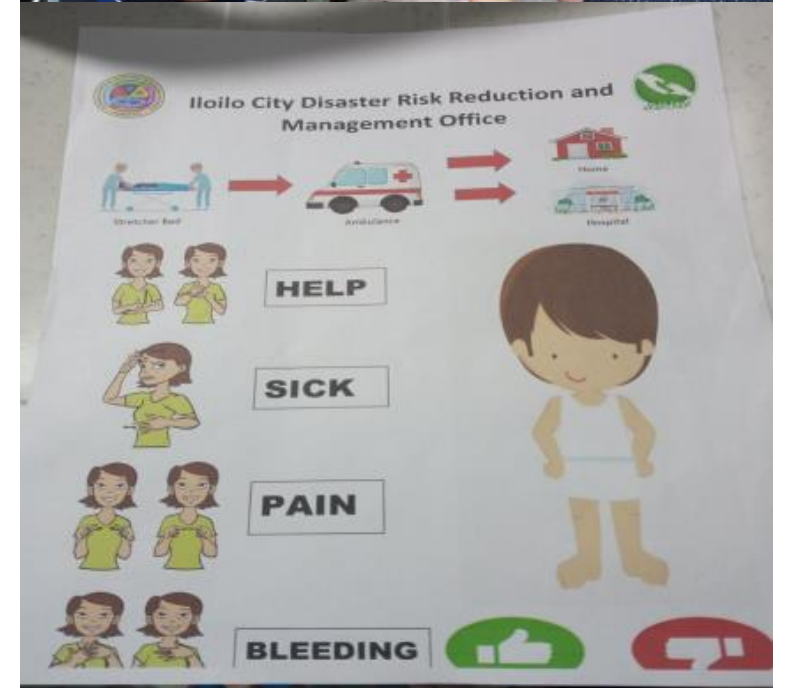

Objective

To raise awareness of the public by strengthening the capacity of the city government and its stakeholders to address disaster issues.

Summary of key process, programs and activities

Community level:

1. Localizing knowledge acquired from Japan to Iloilo.
2. Establishing a network of knowledge and technical resource both in Japan and in Iloilo.
3. Conducted community profiling.
4. Production of IEC material catering to the PWDs.
5. Conduct simulation exercises and trainings.
6. Digital record keeping of all programs and activities.

City level:

1. Mainstreaming DRR in many departments.
2. Identifying specific roles for prevention and response in each department.
3. Passing 8 city ordinances to support PWD-inclusive DRR programs.
4. Implementation of monitoring and evaluation of programs and activities.
5. Rewarding success stories.
